Job Description

Training attachments are available in Edinburgh to appropriate postgraduate applicants in Orthopaedic Surgery. Applicants should be South African citizens or permanent residents.

The Fellow will participate in all aspects of patient care at The New Royal Infirmary in Edinburgh including clinics, educational meetings, research and varied surgical procedures. The Fellow will also get an opportunity to conduct his/her own operating lists. The fellowship is primarily in arthroplasty, but it may be possible to accommodate related surgical interests.

Experience will be gained in primary joint replacement (cemented and cementless), complex primary joint replacement and revision surgery. There will be exposure to robotic joint replacement and the fellow will also have opportunities to participate in elbow and ankle arthroplasty surgery.
